DIRECT RECRUITMENT IN MADHYA PRADESH HIGHER JUDICIAL SERVICE (ENTRY LEVEL)

Applications are invited for 20 posts in Madhya Pradesh Higher Judicial Service in the pay scale of Rs. 16750-400-19150-450-20500 in the cadre of Higher Judicial Service by direct recruitment from amongst the eligible advocates. Recruitment to these posts and conditions of service will be governed by the Madhya Pradesh Uchchatar Nyayik Seva (Bharti Tatha Seva Sharten) Niyam, 1994 (as amended upto date) published in Madhya Pradesh Rajpatra (ASADHARAN) dated 23-11-1994 and amendment published vide Madhya Pradesh Rajpatra (ASADHARAN) dated 8-6-2005. Out of these 20 posts, 10 posts are for the candidates belonging to unreserved category, 3 posts are reserved for Scheduled Caste Candidates and 4 posts are reserved for Scheduled Tribe Candidates and 3 posts are reserved for Other Backward Class Candidates, as per schedule for each class is applicable in M.P. Provided that, if sufficient number of suitable candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe/Other Backward Class are not available, such posts shall be treated as "unreserved".

The number of aforesaid vacancies are likely to be modified depending upon the requirement of the High Court and exigency of the situation as and when necessary.

2. No person shall be eligible for appointment to the post of District Judge (Entry Level) in Higher Judicial Service by direct recruitment unless: -

- (a) He is a citizen of India;
- (b) He has attained the age of 35 years and has not attained the age of 48 years as on 1st January, 2008.

Note :- Candidate must be born between 01-01-1960 to 01-01-1973 including both the dates.

- (c) He has practiced as an Advocate for not less than seven years as on 1-1-2008 and
- (d) He has good character and is of sound health and free from any bodily defects, which render him, unfit for such appointment.

3. Advocates interested in and who are eligible for being considered for the post should submit their applications as per the format appended to this advertisement alongwith certificates/ testimonials relating to their date of birth, caste, qualifications, domicile, experience, standing at the Bar.

A certificate from the Secretary of the State Bar Council or President/Secretary of concerned Bar Association, that he/she is an advocate having practiced for not less than seven years, as such in the format given at Annexure, should be accompanied with the application.

4. The application form duly signed, alongwith two recent passport size photographs and one self addressed envelope (11 cms x 5 cms), addressed to the Registrar General, High Court of Madhya Pradesh, Jabalpur-482007, should reach the Registry of this Court on or before **12-9-2008**. The words "APPLICATION FOR APPOINTMENT IN MADHYA PRADESH HIGHER JUDICIAL SERVICE" should be super scribed on the top of the envelope. The application must be submitted in the appended format and it must be typewritten. The application forms are available on the Website of the High Court (www.mphighcourt.nic.in). The application forms are also available in the Registry of the High Court.
5. Fee for candidates belonging to General category shall be Rs. 750/- and fee for Scheduled Caste Candidates, Scheduled Tribe Candidates and Other Backward Class candidates shall be Rs. 500/-. Fee should be submitted by a Demand Draft drawn in favour of Registrar General, High Court of Madhya Pradesh, Jabalpur, payable at State Bank of India, Main Branch, Civil Lines, Jabalpur. The candidates are required to mention their names and address on the back of the Demand Draft.
6. Candidates are cautioned that their applications will be summarily rejected if by the last date for the receipt of applications, they are found to be incomplete or/and are not accompanied by the requisite documents as mentioned in clause 3 above.
7. Non-receipt of forms of application etc. in time by the candidates will not be accepted as an excuse for late submission of application forms.

8. (i) For the purpose of shortlisting of candidates a preliminary examination comprising of, an objective test shall be conducted and the candidates who qualify in the said preliminary examination at the High Court of Madhya Pradesh, Jabalpur, or at such other places as may be specified by the High Court, will be permitted to appear in the main examination. The questions in the Preliminary Examination will be on Law (same subjects as specified in Para 8 (iii), English and General Knowledge.
- (ii) Candidates, who qualify in the preliminary examination, will be required to appear in main written Examination at their own expenses at the High Court of Madhya Pradesh, Jabalpur or at such other places as may be specified by the High Court.
- (iii) The Written Examination shall consist of two papers, each of 3 hours duration and of maximum 100 marks each. The object of the written test is to assess the knowledge of a candidate in Law and latest pronouncements. 1st paper shall relate to Constitution of India, Civil Procedure Code, Criminal Procedure Code, Indian Penal Code, Hindu Marriage Act, Hindu Succession Act, Hindu Adoptions and Maintenance Act, Transfer of Property Act, Contract Act, Specific Relief Act, M.P. Accommodation Control Act, Limitation Act, Evidence Act, M.P. Land Revenue Code, Narcotic Drugs Psychotropic Substances Act, Schedule Caste & Schedule Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, Prevention of Corruption Act, Negotiable Instruments Act and Electricity Act, 2003.

Second paper will be in two parts, the first part will contain factual data of a Civil Case and a Criminal Case on the basis of which the candidate shall prepare judgment in the Civil Case and Criminal Case. The Second part will contain a passage in Hindi to be translated into English and a passage in English to be translated into Hindi.

- (iv) Only such candidates, who secure minimum marks in each of papers in the written examination as decided by the High Court, will be called for interviews.
 - (v) The interview shall carry 50 marks and minimum 20 marks have to be secured by the candidates.
 - (vi) Candidates shall be selected on the basis of marks obtained by them in each paper of the main written examination and interview separately, subject to obtaining minimum marks as fixed by High Court in the written examination as well as in the interview.
 - (vii) On completion of the selection process, the result of examination (list of selected candidates) shall be published in M.P. Rajpatra. The result of all the candidates both successful and unsuccessful shall be declared on the website of the M.P. High Court.
9. If any of the particulars furnished in application and enclosures are found to be false within the knowledge of the candidate or if he is found to have willfully suppressed any material fact relating to his application, he shall, if appointed, liable to be dismissed from service.
 10. A candidate selected for appointment shall be required to undergo medical examination of physical fitness by a Medical Board before he is appointed. Every candidate who

appears before a Medical Board shall pay the Medical Examination fee, which in no case shall be refundable.

11. (a) The training shall be such as may be prescribed by the High Court.

(b) A person appointed in the Madhya Pradesh Higher Judicial Service shall be on probation for a period of two years and the High Court may extend the period of probation. The total period of probation shall not ordinarily exceed four years. The High Court may at any time during or at the end of period of probation recommend termination of services of such probationers.

12. Canvassing in any form will be a disqualification. Similarly, any attempt on the part of a candidate to enlist support for his application through persons of influence or officers of Government will disqualify him for appointment.
